Guest Speaker. Anna Healey.

Anna trained as a legal advocate and now works in helping people with NDIS packages. She was previously an actor and producer and writer of stage plays. She is also a secondary school teacher specialising in theatre and drama studies.

Anna has continued to write. As a teacher she worked mainly with young people and middle teenagers. Her own disability of over thirty years has not stopped her from achieving her aims. She has been to three Olympic games and enjoys sailing her own boat.

Anna is asking RI Ocean Grove for help to produce her most recent play at the Potato Shed. She is the director, producer, and writer of "Let it Rain." The play is about mental health issues, especially with teenagers with whom she has had contact. She plans to commence the production in secondary colleges so the issues are 'out there' and they can be aired and discussed. Her aim is to have the play staged during Mental Health week in October.

The need to have these issues discussed is pressing as effects are widespread on most of the community and she believes the problem is not being addressed widely enough and therefore the problem is not being resolved. The Board will consider her request for either financial support of physical assistance in publicity.


Start serving @ end of Anzac Service.
