

Junior Awards presentations: Paul Brewster.

Paul outlined the history of the award. In started in Bairnsdale in 1997. Graeme Bath, a member of our club introduced it to our area in 1999. The Junior Community Awards are now recognised throughout Australia and have been introduced into England, Scotland and Wales. Canada and Hong Kong are considering the project.

There are 4 sections to the award:

- 1. Community Service.
- 2. Physical Recreation.
- 3. Skill Development.
- 4. Social Experience. This section has 6 subsections including attendance at a community celebration, attendance at a community meeting, a cultural exchange, a religious or spiritual experience, experience an event involving the Arts and environmental awareness.

Students keep a diary which is signed off by a supervising adult.

There were 3 participating primary schools this year. Surfside Primary School: 11 students.; Ocean Grove Primary School: 12 students.; Our Lady Star of the Sea: 16 students.

Two students from the participating schools presented various aspects the program and experiences they had. The standard of work presented was very good and the experience gained should be valuable throughout life in the future.

The whole idea of the Junior Community Awards is to give young students the opportunity to think about how important being a member of a community can be. This aim appeared to have been achieved as several students hoped they could continue some aspects of their experience in the community as volunteers.

Parents, teachers and members appeared to enjoy the presentations very much. Perhaps hope for the future was encouraged in those who listened. All participants and facilitators were warmly thanked.
