Board activity and decisions.

- · Anzac Day BBQ will go ahead.
- A donation of \$5000 has been given to the **Central Victorian Relief Fund** following the bushfires in that area.
- The Club is supporting the establishment of the new **Probus Club** at Point Lonsdale.

Conference Report: Gill Morgan. Idea of creating a "Peace Park" in Ocean Grove was proposed

- **RYLA:** There are 18 attending this year. A 'Mum and Dad' support team is needed for the week. The Ocean Grove Business Association may be able to suggest future candidates.
- It was suggested that Rotary brand clothing be worn to meetings to increase public profile.
- Australian Rotary Health is involved in eradication of Polio, Cot deaths, treatment of Pancreatic Cancer, motor neurone disease and organ transplantation after donor death.
- There have been no new cases of Polio reported since October 2023. This must continue for another 2 years and 9 months for it can be said to be finally eradicated.
- Speakers included Gary Newton on living with polio, Kirrily Dear on her run from Broken Hill to Sydney to publicise the need to stop family violence, especially in remote areas, Nick Newling spoke on his experience and survival through long years with severe mental illness, and Lorimer Mosely spoke on non-surgical intervention in pain management.

Guest Speaker: Graeme Batrouney. Cambodian Student Scholarship Program. 2023.

Graeme outlined the progress of our Cambodian student Chhengheang during the last year. She is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Ocean Grove and supported by the Cambodian Rural Students Trust and the Rotoract Club of Siem Reap Cambodia.

The cost of the scholarship is US\$2,000 per year. RI Ocean Grove Commitment is for 4 years.

When the student graduates from High School the smartest

students are selected to enter the Global Rotaractor Scholarship program and enrolled at Pannastra University of Cambodia. They are ready for the intensive English course for academic purposes. All bachelor's degree subjects are taught in English.

In the first 12 months students are required to volunteer 2-3 hours 5 days per week at placements outside the university in Community

These programs are all community-based giving students an allround experience to prepare for the bachelor's degree and working life perhaps in education, finance, international relations and hotel administration.

Graeme illustrated his talk with some photos of Chhengheang's experiences during the past year, these included tree planting, selling food at the water festival to raise funds for Rotaract projects, and a trip to Kulen mountain schools to provide material for the students there.

It appears that our contribution to this project is making a real difference to this students life in Cambodia and no doubt the lives of those she has contact with in the future.

Reports from Meredith O'Neill:

ROTARY COMMUNITY LEADER POSITION

As part of the Regionalisation Pilot our club has been allocated to a Rotary Community Group. Expressions of interest are now invited for the position of Rotary Community Leader for our group.

Information was included in an email dated 12 March that was sent by Lesley Sheddon, District Governor Elect. Any member can nominate for the Rotary Community Leader position provided they meet the 4 year (or 2 years in special circumstances) Rotary membership requirement and other conditions. A Position Description is available in this email. The emphasis is on inspiring and mentoring clubs in our Rotary Community Group to expand their community impact, increase satisfaction of members and grow their clubs. There is an expectation to lead club engagement on behalf of the Regional Council in support of clubs fulfilling their purpose. Interested applicants also need to click the link in the email to read the notes of the Establishment Group meeting for the Geelong clubs. The Expression of Interest form is to be completed and lodged by the deadline of 5 pm Wednesday 27 March. Prior to lodging of the Expression of Interest the club is required to support the application with a resolution at a club meeting.

DISTRICT 9780 CONFERENCE REPORT

This report includes some additional information to what Meredith presented at the club meeting.

The conference at Mt Gambier last weekend was attended by ten members – President Lyn, Pearl,



Meredith, Kath, Gill, Anne, Rod, Judy, Gordon and Marian. The theme of the Conference was `Health and Well Being including Youth Mental Health. The format was speaker to audience sessions in a large group. The range of presentations included academic reports with the latest research and credible statistics, informative presentations from Rotary speakers covering Rotary programs and causes, awareness raising sessions, speakers providing inspiration for a cause and a personal story of lived experience of mental illness.

The House of Friendship showcased different Rotary programs. Thanks to Kath for spending all tea breaks and lunchtime at the Shelter Box display table.

Club awards were presented at the Conference. The Rotary Club of Ocean Grove received a Silver Enviro award and recognition of our financial contribution to Polio Plus.

Action Items following from the Conference.

1. Youth Programs

There was a lengthy morning session covering the following Youth Programs:

Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) - April 2024

Rotary Youth Exchange

National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) - Students entering year 12

Defying the Drift - Agriculture/Horticulture program at Longerenong 23-25 Sept, years 9 and 10

Science and Engineering Challenge - held at Deakin, years 9 and 10 students

2. Rotary Foundation

Mark Anderson, Rotary Foundation Senior Coordinator, South Pacific and the Philippines Office provided an informative presentation that linked club programs to vision, mission, goals and areas of focus. He also spoke about effective use of Rotary Foundation global and district grants.

Meredith plans to work with Kath and Gordon on summarising the key takeaways from this session and providing a report on funding allocation for the Board to consider.

3. Say No to Family and Domestic Violence Campaign.

Carolyn Millard, Rotary Club of Portland, provided an overview of what the clubs in our district were doing. She spoke of the collaboration taking place in Geelong and the need to find out what the local services are doing. Meredith is to have follow up discussions with Andrea.

4. International Programs

The late Sunday morning session included a panel presentation on `Celebrating the Achievements of Rotary Programs'. This included:

- Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS)
- Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC)
- Interplast Australia and New Zealand
- · Rotarians Against Malaria.

Kath will present information from this session at a future club meeting.

5. Matters to be referred to the Board.

Collated and up to date information on different Rotary programs will be provided to the Board to be used as part of our strategic planning process.

The matter of the Club Banner had already been identified as an agenda item for the next Board meeting. Pearl and Meredith spent time at the Conference looking at all the banners from the clubs in our district and there are two distinct styles of banner. There is no urgency to get a new banner as it is possible there may be another banner style once Regionalisation commences.

Our club will have a banner with Ocean Grove on it for display at the next District Conference and the Board will consider the design of this banner at an appropriate time.

6. Awareness raising Youth Mental Health
