Guest Speaker. Meryn Pease. Australian Rotary Health.

Australian Rotary Health is one of the largest independent funders of mental health research within Australia. It is a project of the Rotary Districts of Australia supported by Rotary Clubs. It was established as a charitable fund in 1981 by Rotarian PP Ian Scott and the Rotary Club of Mornington to research Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. There has been a reduction of 80% in deaths world-wide from this syndrome following this research.

Since inception Rotary Health has funded over \$50million in research with the generous support of Rotarians and more latterly individual, commercial and government supporters. All money raised/donated is used in research projects. Purpose Statement: We Fund Health Research in four main categories.

Mental Health Research. The main focus of research from the year 2000 was focused on Mental health of young Australians. In 2023 grants have been aimed at the mental health of children aged 0-12. Much of the results of work in this area is brought to public awareness through the 'Lift the Lid' campaign.

General Health Research. Funding is provided for research projects in general health issues such as prostate cancer, effects of gut bacteria on health, heart disease, children's health, motor neuron disease, diabetes, and others.

Indigenous Health Scholarships. Funding is provided for indigenous scholars to undertake study and qualifications in health-related courses including nursing, physiotherapy, psychology, and dentistry. Rural Medical and Nursing Scholarships. Medical and Nursing students are encouraged to undertake placements in rural and remote areas of practice in the hope that graduates will have a worthwhile experience and pursue a career in these areas in the future.

Meryn asked members to think about what our Club might consider doing to help create awareness of the work of Australian Rotary Health. The website and social media are good sources of information.

Banners for display at local events are available. The club could consider a health-related project perhaps in partnership with another club in the district
