Five on Me - Geoff Brentnall

Geoff asked to speak this week because Parkinson's disease is beginning to affect his speech. Geoff gave some of his family background. His parents married at the end of World War 11 with his father still in army uniform. He was their first child, followed by his bother Ron in 15 months and another brother six years younger than him. His father Melvin grew up in Ivanhoe but was often called 'Snow'. His father was a Sergeant during the war but had previously been in the army as a Warrant Officer. He was a draftsman in the Survey Unit and then worked for the Lands Department. His father did the drawings for the first Melway's Street Directory. His mother did home duties. Geoff also told the tale of one of his ancestors who was exiled and changed his name when he came to Australia. He had nine legitimate children and at least four illegitimate ones which makes for the large family tree.

Geoff decided he wanted to become a pharmacist after an incident when as a young child he fell out from his great-grandfather's dodgy car door and was taken to a pharmacy to be treated. Despite failing chemistry at high school and college, he never wanted to be anything else. Geoff was eligible for the Vietnam War draft but opted to take five years in the Army Reserve instead of conscription. He served in the Medical and Dental Depot and was employed at pharmacies at Northlands and Eastlands where he met John Newcombe.

Geoff's passions are -

- His three children and five grandchildren;
- Sport: the Collingwood Football Club. Cricket which he played quite well although his brother was better. Geoff is a life member of the Leopold Cricket Club and 15 years member of the MCC. He also played tennis and badminton.

- Rotary.

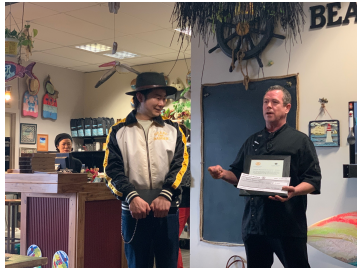
